

How to Use Open Data for Expense and Revenue Budget

The Ministry of Finance (MOF), UAE, allows the availability of open data through various formats and programs to facilitate their accessibility for research and innovation. MOF's authorization to use open data by developers, media, the public, and researchers is to align with the open government concepts and the digital data era.

Open data can be used, distributed, reused, and shared by anyone without financial, legal, or technical restrictions, provided the users mention the document source and abide by copyleft licenses.

MoF is committed to certain terms and conditions associated with the use of open data, which include:

- Ensuring the use of open data does not conflict with UAE and international laws.
- Abstaining from publishing or disclosing information that falls under other intellectual property rights, such as patents and trademarks.
- Specifying the source of original material and allowing users to use original materials.
- Not using personal data such as IDs, passports, or national identities.

Open Budget Data for Expense and Revenue

The budget-related expense and revenue table in the Microsoft Excel sheet illustrates expenses and revenue incurred for the account groups of entities under the Ministry from 2014.

- ✓ The data on Expense and Revenue Budget is distributed across the years starting from 2014.
- ✓ The Expense and Revenue Budget incurred by each Ministry for each entity on multiple accounts and locations can be ascertained from the data.
- ✓ The users can apply filters to do a data drill-down.

While using the open budget data, it is essential to consider certain aspects, including MoF's obligations to customers, guidelines on using open data, and responsibilities of open data users at MoF.

User Responsibilities

- Adhere to the 'open data' principle and share the information with the public.
- Attribute MOF as the data source when reusing open data from the MOF website
- Refrain from using data for political purposes, illegal or criminal activities, or anything that may negatively impact the UAE's name or position or go against its societal values.
- Users are granted the freedom to copy, reproduce, and communicate the information to the public in any format and adapt or modify the data for both commercial and non-commercial purposes.
- Acknowledge the author's name or identification and preserve any copyright notices in the original material.
- Additionally, users are encouraged to incorporate a URL or hyperlink to the licensed material whenever feasible.

Adherence to these crucial conditions is paramount, as failure to comply may result in the withdrawal of the rights granted under the license.
